The situation of evacuation from East Galilee:

- Of the evacuated cluster residents, 9,286 are children aged 0-18.
- 2,842 of the children are evacuated to hotels
- 6,444 children are being evacuated in the community (not staying in hotels).

Resident Status Survey:

About 2,000 residents from the Eastern Galilee cluster participated in the second resident status survey conducted by the Knowledge Center in November.

Health Survey:

Following a joint decision by the Golan Regional Council and the Katzrin Local Council to work to promote health in the Golan region, they established a professional team integrated with the Knowledge Center and the Eastern Galilee Cluster. The joint team chose to promote a survey of the health status of residents and the services that exist today in the Golan region under the professional leadership of the Knowledge Center. The survey was conducted in September 2024 and was attended by 2137 residents: 357 of Katzrin and 1780 residents of the Golan Regional Municipality.

From the reports of the survey respondents, we learn of significant difficulty in receiving responses in the following areas:

87% - Paramedical fields

87% - Dentistry

86% - Geriatric medicine

48% - Family medicine

72% - Women's medicine

In addition, 98% report low satisfaction with the availability of mental health services in the region.

Education follow-up research:

The follow-up research conducted by Dr. Ayla Cohen and Dr. Dafna Gross-Manos from the Department of Social Work and in collaboration with the Regional Knowledge Center raised the need to work with education teams to assist them in stressful situations with students.

In collaboration with the Haruv Institute, learning, thinking, and discussion sessions will be held for education teams in the north on the topic of trauma-aware Education.
